GUIDELINES ON THE RESUMPTION OF VISA APPLICATIONS



Please be informed that effective 01 April 2022, The Embassy of the Philippines will resume accepting 9a visa applications for regular, tourist and business visits. However, applicants for student visa (9f) still need to coordinate with their Philippine school for the processing of their visa in the Philippines.

Visa Applicants are instructed to enroll their visa applications at visa.gov.ph. A notification from the Embassy will be received for the schedule of their interview.

Please be reminded that entry into the Philippines of foreign nationals is **STILL SUBJECT** to the following conditions:

- a. Are fully vaccinated, except for minor children below 12 years of age traveling with their fully vaccinated parents;
- b. Carry/posses an acceptable proof of vaccination;
- c. Present a negative RT-PCR test taken within forty-eight (48) hours or a negative laboratory-based Antigen test taken within twenty four (24) hours, prior to the date and time of departure from the

country of origin/first port of embarkation in a continuous travel to the Philippines, excluding lay-overs; provided that he/she has not left the airport premises or has not been admitted to a third country;

d. Have passports valid for at least six (6) months at the time of their arrival to the Philippines;

e. Have valid tickets for their return journey to the port of origin or next port of destination not later than thirty (30) days from date of arrival in the Philippines (except for foreign spouses, children of Filipino citizens and former Filipino citizens, balikbayans); AND

f. Obtain, prior to arrival, a travel insurance for COVID-19 treatment costs from reputable insurance providers, with a minimum coverage of USD 35,000.00 for the duration of their stay in the Philippines.
