NEW ARRIVAL GUIDELINES
FOR THE PHILIPPINES



Section 1 (No need for entry exemption)

Pursuant to IATF Resolution No. 165, Entry exemption documents shall no longer be required for foreign nationals traveling to the Philippines, provided that they comply with applicable visa requirements and immigration entry and departure formalities; provided further that they:

- a. Are fully vaccinated as defined in the succeeding section, except for minor children below 12 years of age traveling with their fully vaccinated parents;
- b. Carry/posses an acceptable proof of vaccination as set out in Section 3 below;
- c. Present a negative RT-PCR test taken within forty-eight (48) hours or a negative laboratory-based Antigen test taken within twenty four (24) hours, prior to the date and time of departure from the country of origin/first port of embarkation in a continuous travel to the Philippines, excluding lay-overs; provided that he/she has not left the airport premises or has not been admitted to a third country;
- d. Have passports valid for at least six (6) months at the time of their arrival to the Philippines;



NEW ARRIVAL GUIDELINES FOR THE PHILIPPINES

- e. Have valid tickets for their return journey to the port of origin or next port of destination not later than thirty (30) days from date of arrival in the Philippines (except for foreign spouses, children of Filipino citizens and former Filipino citizens, balikbayans); AND
- f. Obtain, prior to arrival, a travel insurance for COVID-19 treatment costs from reputable insurance providers, with a minimum coverage of USD 35,000.00 for the duration of their stay in the Philippines

Section 2 (Vaccination)

A foreign national is considered fully vaccinated if they have:

From more than 14 days prior to date and time of departure, received all prescribed doses of a vaccine included in the Emergency Use Listing of the WHO or was given an Emergency Use Authorization List or Compassionate Special permit by the Philippine Food and Drug Administration

Section 3 (Proof of vaccination)

- a. WHO International Certificate of Registration
- b. VaxCertPH
- c. National or State Digital Certificate of country which has accepted VaxCertPH under a reciprocal arrangement
- d. other proof of vaccination permitted by the IATF

No quarantine period shall be observed but individuals are enjoined to self monitor for seven (7) days.
